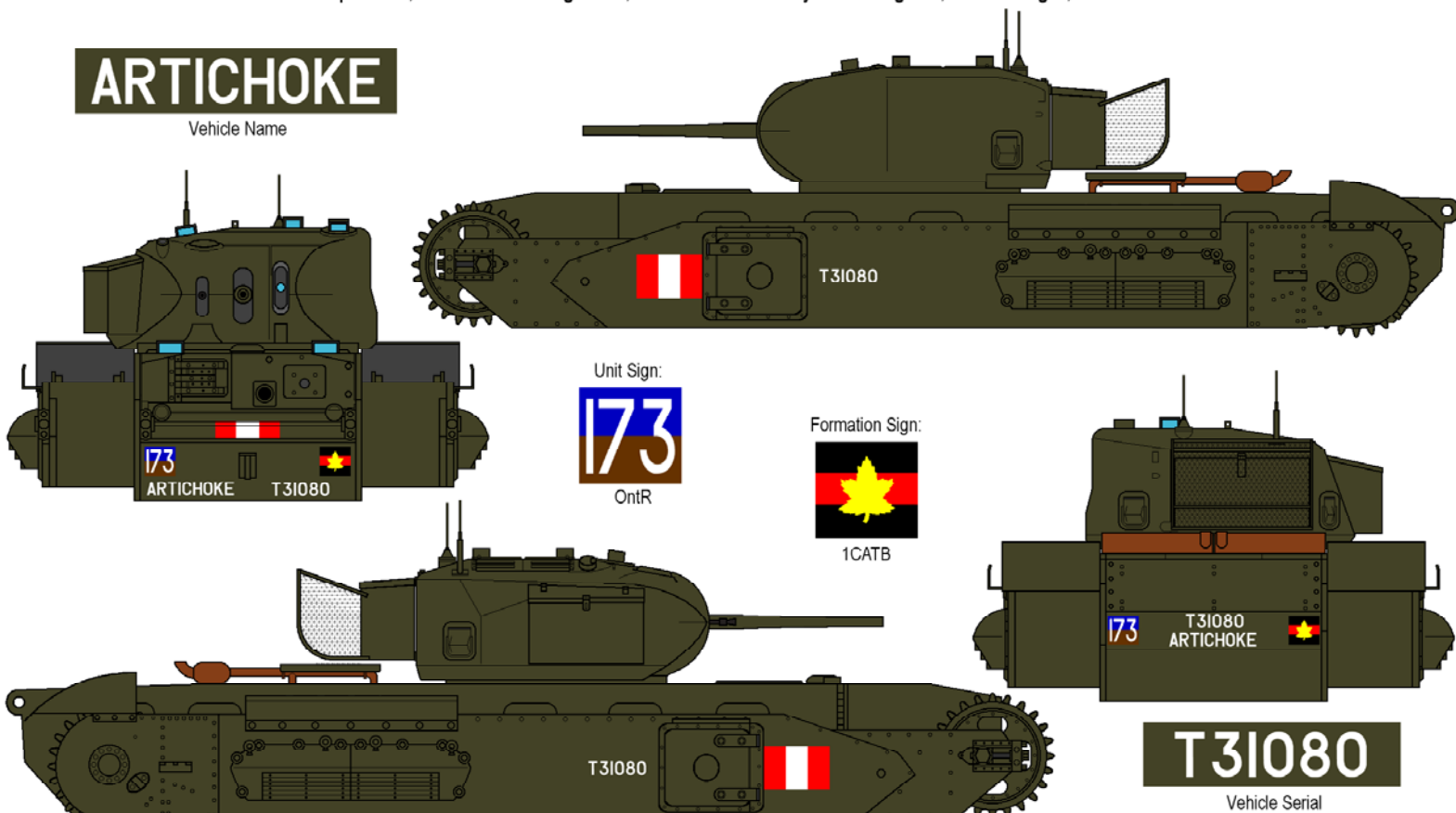

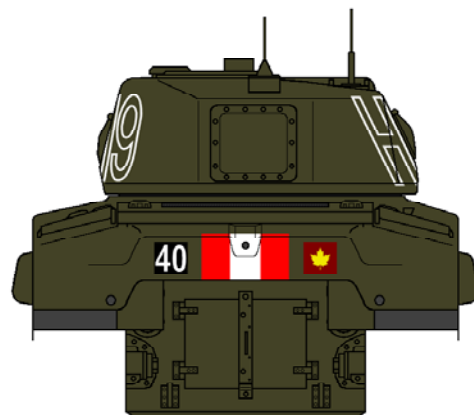
Ram Mk.II 'H19' - 5th Canadian Division Headquarters, UK, 20 April 1943



The 'H19' on the turret merely indicates one vehicle of many assigned to Divisional Headquarters.

This tank has neither main gun or machine guns, there being what appears to be a log and a stick respectively, as substitutes.

This vehicle was used as a carrier for the Bailey bridge during vehicle trials which ultimately led to the Churchill AVRE as the vehicle of choice.

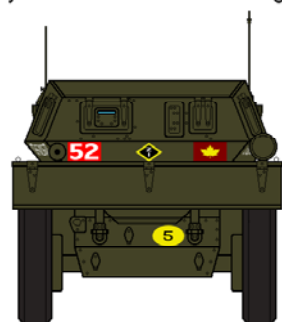
