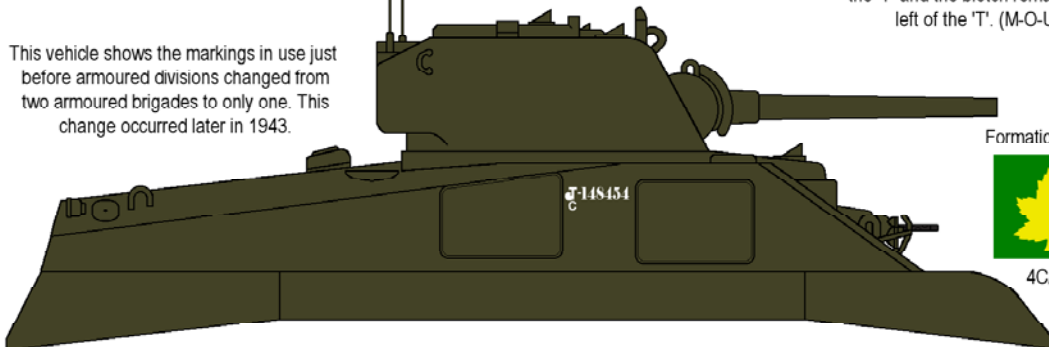


The right side serial appears as if the painter tried to get the 'C' before the 'T' but the auxiliary armour got in the way, resulting in the 'C' appearing under the 'T' and the blotch remaining to the left of the 'T'. (M-O-U-S-E)

A Canadian Sherman with track covers fitted indicates a freshly-issued vehicle as they were usually immediately removed.

Middle Bronze Green No.23 (G3)

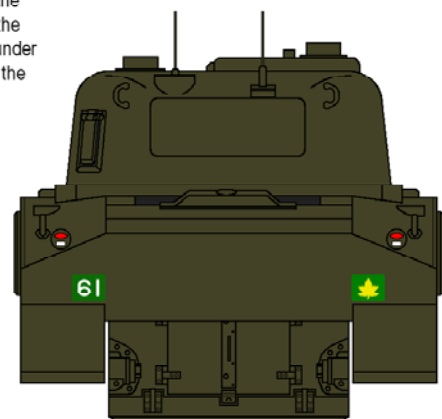
This vehicle shows the markings in use just before armoured divisions changed from two armoured brigades to only one. This change occurred later in 1943.
