Part 3: The Three Rivers Regiment - the Early Years

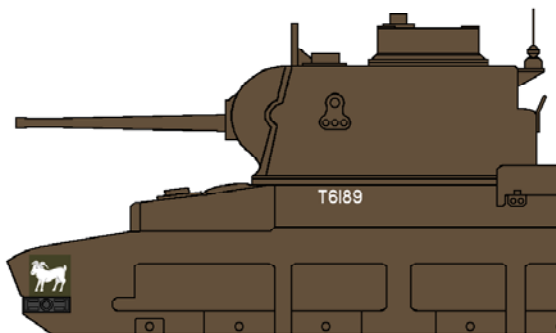
Matilda Mk.II - possibly 'B' Squadron (see comment with ram marking below), Salisbury Plain, Sept 1941.

The ram insignia (from Gen Worthington's family crest) was painted on a 10" x 10" khaki square on the side of the tank as shown. Initially the ram appeared without gonads, necessitating a return to the painter for an upgrade. It would appear later as an arm patch and on a black square as a formation sign on the Churchills at Dieppe. This vehicle has no markings, leading me to wonder if the first two vehicles do not wear the markings of their previous users.

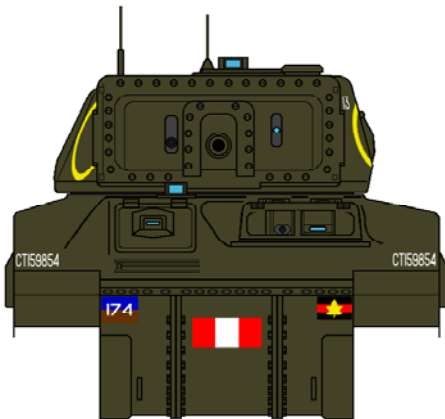

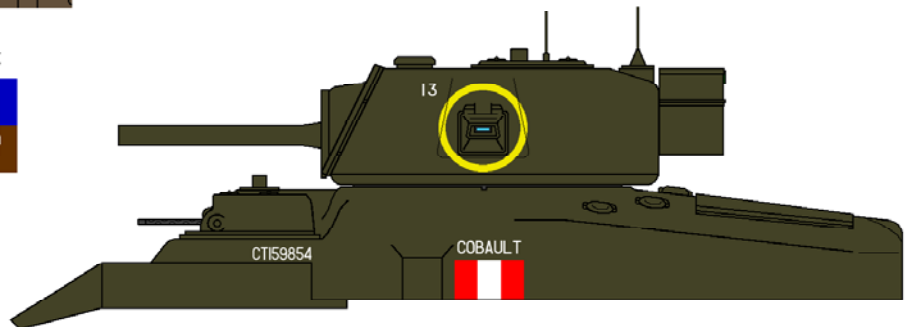

3RR

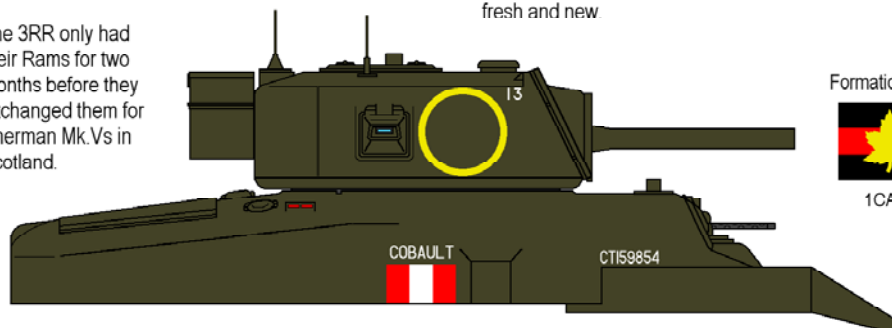


Squadron markings are as large as could be fitted and still maintain their shape. All markings are fresh and new.
